



Recruitment VAVASC Study - 2022








- 23/05/23 Tiernan Coulter/ Prof AJ McKnight (£2200) 8 week summer studentship. Exploration of telomere biology in kidney disease patients. NIKRF – Janet Greeves Legacy Fund Training Grant
- 22/05/23 Dr Clare McKeaveney (£120k)- Using the ADAPT Guidance to Refine a Video Educational Series for Kidney Transplantation and living donation - 18 months
- 13/10/22 Dr Carolyn Blair (£26.7k 50% fundings with matched funding from PHA) A Cochrane systematic review assessing the effects of multimodal interventions that aim to alleviate and/or stabilise cachexia or forms of wasting in citizens with a chronic illness (including chronic kidney disease) - 12 months
- > 04/07/22 Dr Michael Toal (£223.6k) Can cost effective strategies identify and stabilise higher risk patients with Immunoglobulin A Nephropathy and prevent end-stage renal disease? 36 months
- ➢ 30/05/22 Prof Helen Noble (£34.6k) Scoping the practice of art in nephrology across the UK 12 months
